LITURGY: THE "FORM" OF OUR SUNDAY WORSHIP SERVICE

We use projection media to display* parts of the liturgy on the wall left and right behind the pulpit. We also enjoy using the Trinity Hymnal for hymns, especially those who enjoy singing parts.

PRELUDE

We gather our thoughts, feelings and will in anticipation of being together in the presence of God.

GATHERING SONG*

The congregation gathers for worship with a song expressing our joyful desire to worship God together.

INVOCATION AND THE LORD'S PRAYER

The pastor (our "teaching elder") asks God to help us in our worship, calling our attention to God's greatness, justice, mercy and love. We pray together using the words Jesus instructed us to use.

HYMN OF PRAISE*

We use both traditional Psalms, hymns, and spiritual songs.*

RESPONSIVE READING OF GOD'S WORD

We speak together of God and his ways using a Psalm.*

CALL TO HOLY LIVING & PRAYER OF CONFESSION

In God's presence we consider our ways and, as necessary, confess our sins in private prayer to God.

ASSURANCE OF PARDON

Pastor directs us to various Bible passages that proclaim God's forgiveness through Jesus Christ.

SONGS OF PRAISE*

Freshly reminded of our perfection and forgiveness in Christ, we praise God by singing together with contemporary songs.

OUR WORSHIP IN TITHES AND OFFERINGS

We express our commitment to Christ and his Church by giving a portion of our income to Him for use in the work of His Church

DOXOLOGY*

We praise God in song for his goodness to us in Christ.

PASTORAL PRAYER

Pastor leads us in prayer for the general ministry of our congregation, the needs of our people, and our witness to the gospel in our neighborhoods.

MINISTRY OF THE PREACHED WORD AND MONTHLY SACRAMENT*

Pastor presents a word of exhortation, comfort, and instruction from the Bible. The Sacrament of the Lord's Supper is observed the first Sunday of each month. Baptisms are performed as new births or adult conversions present this blessed opportunity.

HYMN OF PRAISE*

We respond to the preached word in a hymn chosen for its expression of the themes of the sermon.

BENEDICTION

Pastor pronounces God's blessing on us, exhorting us to live for Christ in love and righteousness.

Yet a time is coming and has now come when the true worshipers will worship the Father in spirit and truth, for they are the kind of worshipers the Father seeks.

John 4:23

Therefore, since we are receiving a kingdom that cannot be shaken, let us be thankful, and so worship God acceptably with reverence and awe, for our "God is a consuming fire."

Heb. 12:28-29


Sing to God, sing praise to his name, extol him who rides on the clouds--his name is the LORD-- and rejoice before him. Psalm 68:4
